

Statute 774

The Liturgies of the Word Amendment Statute Confirmation Statute, 2024

Whereas:

- (a) The General Synod / Te Hīnota Whānui 2022 enacted as Statute number 767 '*The Liturgies of the Word Amendment Statute, 2022*,' in terms of Part B, Clause 6(a) of the Constitution/te Pouhere, and Section 4(a) of the Church of England Empowering Act 1928 to authorise amendments to the Formularies, and
- (b) Te Rūnanganui o Te Pīhopatanga o Aotearoa, the Synod of the Diocese of Polynesia, and a majority of the Diocesan Synods in New Zealand have assented to the proposal pursuant to Part B, Clause 6(b) of the Constitution/te Pouhere, and Section 4(b) of the Church of England Empowering Act 1928, and
- (c) Since the adoption of this proposal, there has been a fresh election of members of the General Synod / te Hīnota Whānui, in fulfillment of Part B, Clause 6(c) of the Constitution/te Pouhere.

The General Synod / Te Hīnota Whānui enacts as follows:

1. **Title.** The Title of this Statute shall be *The Liturgies of the Word Amendment Confirmation Statute, 2024*.
2. The proposal contained in Statute 767 to Amend '*The Liturgies of the Word*,' is agreed to as follows:

at the appropriate place on page 56, following the words:

ā, haere ake nei. Āmine.

the words

Or

Glory to God, Source of all being, Eternal Word, and Holy Spirit,* as it was in the beginning, is now, and shall be for ever. Amen.

Or

Glory to God, Source of all being, Incarnate Word, and Holy Spirit,* as it was in the beginning, is now and will be forever. Amen.

Or

Glory to the holy and undivided Trinity, one God: as it was in the beginning, is now and will be forever. Amen.

Or

Glory to the Trinity, the only God, for ever and ever.

3. This Statute shall come into force at the conclusion of this 66th Session of the General Synod / te Hīnota Whānui.
